A man and his pastor went golfing. After a bad shot, the man cussed colorfully, and then apologized to the


The pastor told his friend that was OK, because when he hit a bad shot he didn't say anything. He would "just spit — and where he spit, grass didn't grow."



## Interim Report of the Exploratory Committee for Mission Expansion Galt United Methodist Church, 10 March 2021

Galt UMC is a warm welcoming family who worship, pray, learn, and love one another by serving our community so that everyone can encounter the Risen Lord and experience transformation through God's Grace. We are in the heart of the City with a heart <u>for</u> the City. Even as we are discussing the possibility of our mission expansion project with community leaders there is ministry occurring. It is not lost on people that during a time when many Churches are shrinking their community efforts, Galt UMC is expanding its vision of mission and ministry.

While we are not yet ready to make any final recommendation for you to review, we would like to inform our Bishop and Cabinet about the progress we are making in exploring the possibilities for building affordable housing for seniors and veterans and expanding our facilities for our Sunshine Food Pantry by making use of the lots we own adjacent to our Sanctuary/Social Hall

The Exploratory Committee that was established by the Galt UMC Church Council in September 2020 has been meeting every two weeks, with the five members of the Exploratory Committee initiating and attending meetings with city, county, community, and Conference leaders to determine the viability of our project and to adjust our mission vision as questions are answered.

- 1) We began with a concept of a combined housing/food pantry complex on the three lots adjacent to our Sanctuary/Social Hall (and parking lot) now after consulting with Sidney Stone at Christian Church Homes and county officials, it is clear that we will want to separate these two projects in order to get maximum outside funding for each.
- 2) Within the next several months our Exploratory Committee will receive information about the cost and potential funding sources as we clarify the specifics of the two separate projects.

Meantime, our members and constituents at Galt UMC are enthusiastic about moving forward. The timing of this exploration is in perfect alignment with the City of Galt's emphasis on building affordable housing. It's also clear that the devastating economic costs of the pandemic to our most vulnerable citizens will continue to increase the need for our Sunshine Food Pantry into the coming years.

In spite of the challenges of the pandemic, our members and friends have continued to support Galt UMC through their prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. We have been able to pay a full-time appointed Elder without drawing on our savings. We are giving you this status report during this season of appointment making so that you can send us a Pastor who will match our zeal for mission.

Session Four: The Invention That Changed Christianity

### **Gutenberg's Printing Press**

Invented in 1454CE – printed 180 copies of a 42 line Bible

### Translations - Who Gets to Read These Holy Words?

 $Latin\ Vulgate-383-405CE-translated\ from\ original\ Hebrew\ and\ Greek-THE\ translation\ for\ 1000\ years\ and\ still\ what\ Roman\ Catholics\ use$ 

Most people until the Protestant Reformation only new what was taught to them by Catholic priests

Concern by the Vatican that widespread access to Scripture by common people would lead to heresies and lead to God taking offence at people's lack of reverence for the Holy Bible

### John Wycliffe (1328-1384CE)

Translated Latin into common English – after he died of natural causes, his body was exhumed and burned with his writings

#### The Protestant Reformation

Martin Luther nails his theses on the door at a Wittenberg Church documenting abuses of power within the Church (1517CE) claiming that "only Scripture" not custom or tradition form the valid basis of Christian teaching

William Tyndale (1525CE) translated from Latin into English: *I defy the Pope and all his laws: and if God spare my life, ere many years I will cause a boy that driveth the plough shall know more of the Scriptures than thou dost.* Tyndale was martyred for his translation.

Availability of the Bible in the world's languages gave rise to widespread literacy

### King James' Version of the Bible - 1611CE, 1769CE "modernized"

\*50 scholars working together, though 84% direct from Tyndale
