This past Sunday our Exploratory Team presented the first Congregational Town Hall meeting to present findings for our vision of the use of our 3 church owned lots adjacent to church property. Taking part was the panel of Earl Arrants (Co-chair), Pastor Mary (Contact with Conference), Mark King (Contact with real estate), Faye Gaines (Sunshine Pantry), Leesa Klotz (city, state).

They presented Exploratory questions and answers gained through 6 months of exploration. Highlights of the day included:

- 1. Why Build? A vision for making disciples and transforming our community.
- 2. What to build: Senior and veteran low income housing, housing for Sunshine Food Pantry.
- 3. Who Builds? We have been in contact with Christian Church Homes (CCH) recommenced by District Superintendent Debra Brady and Bishop Minerva Carcaño.
- 4. Who pays? CCH obtains federal grants for housing apartments. Sunshine complex will need to seek other funding for this project.

There was time for questions and comments from the congregation. We thank those present for the excellent questions and comments.

This 'N That From Here and There

Last Sunday Pastor Mary shared some humorous anecdotes from her years past as part of Holy Humor Sunday - the Sunday after Easter. That reminded me of an article I

read previously.

The following are excerpts from an article titled "Holy Humor Sunday Lights Up Congregations" by Reporter Bart Jones that appeared in Newsday magazine.

Holy Humor Sunday Services Spread Across U.S.

As the Rev. Thomas Goodhue began his homily, the choir members at his Bay Shore Long Island church pulled out newspapers and held them in front of their faces as they read - seemingly bored to death.

Another time, when Rev. Goodhue went to drink water from a glass at the pulpit, nothing came out. Someone had replaced the water with clear Jell-o.

It wasn't heresy or mean-spiritedness. It was all part of Holy Humor Sunday, an increasingly popular practice on Long Island and nationwide that seeks to mark the Sunday after Easter with a day of joke-telling, skits, pranks and general good humor.

The practice, promoted by a Michigan-based publication called *The Joyful Noiseletter* since 1988, draws large crowds to church on a day that in the past had been among the least attended of the year, Goodhue said.

"It's really astonishing to see the place just packed at a time when it normally would have been practically empty," said Goodhue, former pastor of the United Methodist Church of Bay Shore.

Holy Humor is not just a stunt to boost church attendance. It is based on ancient Christian church tradition and theological teachings. It's saying, there's something more than solemnity and vinegar-faced Christianity. Faith and humor are both powerful healing tools.

The practice began in the first centuries after Christianity was founded and the faithful spent the day after Easter dancing, picnicking, singing and playing practical jokes to try to keep alive the joy of Easter.

In those days, it was known as Bright Monday. Today it's shifted to the Sunday after Easter.

The humor is also aimed at underscoring some of the central messages of Easter. The resurrection of Jesus was sort of God's way of laughing at the devil and getting the last laugh. The Rev. Goodhue adds, "It's a lighthearted way of celebrating the real themes of Easter, which is, love wins over execution. Life is stronger than death. God is stronger than evil."

The practice came and went over the centuries, but the effort by *Joyful Noiseletter* has promoted hundreds of churches around the country to revive it.
