Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless.



This Scripture has been on my mind this week, partly because I am preaching on it next Sunday, but also because it was so clearly evident during the Sunshine Food Pantry this past week. Yes, we distribute food at the Sunshine Food Pantry, but the more enduring gift is that we who volunteer participate in the living presence of God, giving "power to the faint, and strengthening the powerless." I saw the Holy Spirit at

work in the request of a 12 year old girl who asked that we would pray for her to find a friend this year; in the words of a woman in her 30s who cares for an elderly relative as well as raising her own kids and working a part-time job who said to me, "I thought getting help would be embarrassing, but you people make it feel like I am visiting with friends"; in the gratitude and joy and laughter of our time together. All of you who receive this newsletter are helping give power to the faint, and strength to the powerless. That's the Good News of Jesus Christ - ALL participate, ALL are included; there is room for ALL OF US. Not everyone can come to physically help with Sunshine Food Pantry, but your prayers matter lots. Not everyone has the money to increase their giving to the Church, but every dollar you give counts. Not everyone has the time to volunteer, but making time for Worship (whether online or in person) strengthens the resolve of all. Have you not known? Have you not heard? Our Lord Jesus Christ is at the HEART of Galt UMC, with power and strength to transform lives.

Planning for a Good End: Beyond Advanced Directives

Two-part Seminar 9/19/21 and 9/26/21

Dying is a part of life. Yet for all the planning we do for our work, our play, our education, and our celebrations, many people do not plan for the end that will come to us all. Who do you want there when you pass? What kind of paperwork can be done in advance, so your family isn't faced with both sorrow and chaos? How can your death be an expression of your life? Join us for this inspiring and thought-provoking seminar provided by Colleen Hurley and Mary Maaga that will help you prepare for a good end.

<u>Part One, September 19</u>: Definitions and explanations of medical and legal terminology; choices you have; support and resources available; beginning to develop your plan

<u>Part Two, September 26</u>: Part One is required for attending Part Two; planning for your dying space; communicating your wishes with others; thinking through the principles of a good end: *don't leave a mess, do leave a legacy, live the best life you can*

Optional Small Groups: If after attending the Two-part Good End Seminar you would like help in putting your plan together, there is an option to sign up for a 3 session small group facilitated by Colleen Hurley and Mary Maaga.

Colleen Hurley has lived in Galt for 40 years, while working as an educator in the school districts. Now retired, she works as an End-of-Life Doula, providing emotional, physical, and educational aid to a dying person and/or their family. She has been a Hospice volunteer for 6 years.

Mary Maaga holds a PhD in Religion and Society and was trained as an anthropologist in West Africa. Her teaching draws on her many cross-cultural experiences. She has taught classes on healing, wellness, and spiritual growth, including how to understand dying, death, and grief as an expression of love. She currently serves as the pastor at Galt United Methodist Church.
