
Sermon Series "FOR THE BEAUTY OF THE EARTH"

A few words from

Your Exploratory Committee

The Exploratory Committee is delighted to share some of its preliminary findings with you! Our plan is to have an official proposal to present for feedback to our Galt UMC Board of Trustees in early September. We will also have a Town Hall meeting for our entire congregation shortly thereafter. From there the Bishop and Cabinet will review our proposal, then once they give the go ahead (we are prayerful that they will!) then we will have an official Church Conference where we will vote on our proposal. I know that sounds like a lot, but we have already come very far on this journey of developing our empty lots and expanding the Sunshine Food Pantry. Your Exploratory Committee, made up of Co-Chairs Pam Carmichael and myself, and including Pastor Mary, Faye Gaines, Mark King, and Leesa Klotz, have met twice a month since last October and have put in hundreds of hours exploring the many possibilities for the best use of our property for the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ.

- 1) Christian Church Homes (CCH), the developer recommended by the Bishop, found that our two lots were not large enough to place adequate numbers of living units to make the project feasible. After much prayer and lots of meetings, a .6 acre lot was found at 401 Lincoln Way that combined with our .4 acre lots will "pencil in the black" as the contractors say. This "scattered site" building project will provide affordable housing for seniors and veterans. CCH placed a bid of \$299,000 for the 401 Lincoln Way property. We anticipate being offered \$200,000 for our two lots.
- 2) It is the practice of the California-Nevada United Methodist Church Bishop and Cabinet to only allow the sale of local Church property if the monies received are directed toward a mission and/or ministry (not as a nest egg for general budget purposes). If Galt UMC decides to go through with the sale, and the Bishop and Cabinet approve that sale, then we will have \$200,000 to invest toward a free standing Sunshine Food Pantry and Resource Center in the lot where the current Church Office is. We will need to think through peeling off a bit of that money for renovating the current storage rooms on the first floor of the Sanctuary building for our new Church Offices.
- 3) Sunshine Food Pantry has contracted with architect Brian Pendley to create for us a site plan and floor plan for a one-story 4,000 square foot building. Your Exploratory Committee has given him a wish list of features so that we can best serve our beloved Galt community now and into the future.
- 4) We are excited to have gotten this far after all these months of exploring! Please be patient as we put together all the details of our proposal.
