Building on last week's article about being United Methodist: another funky thing about being United Methodist is the way we receive Pastors. Most Churches hire their own ministers, but in the UMC we have them appointed by our Bishop with the advice and discernment of her/his Cabinet of District Superintendents. Here's what I love about this system – as a woman, and my husband and I as a mixed-race couple, were unlikely to get hired by any particular local Church: too much of a risk of alienating people who are uncomfortable with change. But in the UMC we are evaluated by our gifts and appointed by the Bishop to a local Church based on how the Holy Spirit leads, regardless of gender or race. That is how I got appointed to Galt UMC. Now it's not all

Spirit led. I have a chance to let Bishop Carcaño know whether or like I would like to return, and your Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) has a chance to let her know whether you would like to stick with the Pastor you have, or whether it is time for a change. This month some of those wheels are beginning to turn. SPRC, in consultation with Finance Committee, will be making a recommendation to Church Council as to whether to request a full-time Pastoral appointment in 2022. Then, at our Charge Conference on October 18th, we will meet with our District Superintendent David Niu and make that request official. Later in the Fall the SPRC will decide whether or not to ask our Bishop to re-appoint me in particular, and I will fill out a form requesting re-appointment or appointment to another Church or ministry. Spoiler alert: I will be asking to stay!

This 'N That From Here and There

The Beloved Will Rogers

Humorist/Journalist Will Rogers was probably the most beloved and popular American Humorist since Mark Twain.

Rev. Cy Eberhart, a Will Rogers biographer, reported this response from Rogers when someone questioned him about his faith: "People often ask me, 'What are you, Will?' Well, I was raised predominately a Methodist, but I have traveled so much, mixed with so many people in all parts of the world, I don't know just what I am. I know I have never been a nonbeliever. I do know that I am broad-minded in a religious way. Which way you serve your God will never get one word of argument or condemnation out of me. There have been times when I wished there had been as much real religion among some of the creeds as there has been vanity."

Rogers kept Americans laughing and lifted their spirits during the dark days of the Great Depression. When he died, 100,000 people paid their respects to him in his coffin.

Rev. Eberhart reported that the ecumenical Rogers' memorial service was presided over by a Protestant minister, a Catholic priest, and a Jewish performer singing a Hebrew mourning chant. Mexican-American citizens nearby placed a memorial wreath in their neighborhood. "The Friends of Ethiopia," an African American group, joined a parade in Rogers' honor. In Oklahoma, where Rogers was born of Cherokee Indian parentage, Cherokee Indians performed a death dance in his memory.
