Once a year the District Superintendent for the Central Valley District of the United Methodist Church comes and



Galt United Methodist Church Special Church Conference Minutes October 14, 2021, 6:30pm, in person in the Sanctuary at Galt UMC

The meeting of the Special Church Conference was opened by Rev. Mary Maaga to present and vote on selling of the church's two lots to Christian Church Homes for the development of affordable housing for seniors and veterans. Proceeds from the sale to be held in trust for building a free-standing Sunshine Food Pantry and Resource Center on the lot adjacent to the parking lot. Pastor Mary recognized Rich Lozano, Galt City Council Member, Sidney Stone, Director of Real Estate Development of Christian Church Homes, Bonnie Rodriguez of the Galt Herald attending and introduced Rev. Gary Pope-Sears presiding on behalf of District Superintendent David Niu.

Rev. Pope-Sears presented devotions from scripture in Hebrews 12:1-2 and lead the congregation in prayer. He introduced Earl Arrants, historian for the church and Exploratory Committee Co-chair. Mr. Arrants gave a short analysis on dates when the lots were purchased, how we retained them and subsequently used them for a community garden. They have been vacant land for several years.

Faye Gaines told her story as director of the Food Pantry and its growth. In a video prepared by Rev. Joe Carmichael, participants in the Food Closet told of the benefits many have had with the food pantry and in person.

Pam Carmichael, Co-chair of the Exploratory Committee talked about, from beginning to end the year project of research the committee has used to get where it is today.

A video presentation by Sidney Stone explained overall what Christian Church Homes does and told of meetings with the City of Galt and Rich Lozano.

Leesa Klotz fielded questions from attendees as a member of the Exploratory Committee. She and Sidney Stone answered questions and comments from members of the congregation. Sandy Benadum, Joe Carmichael, Alan Weinel, Olivia Klotz, Michele Weinel, Mattie Shepherd, Madeline Powell and Colleen Hurley received thorough straightforward and concise answers.

Mark King, as a member of the committee, explained his position and his enthusiasm for the Sunshine Food Pantry benefiting from this project. He called for a vote on the motion: Approve the selling of the church's two empty lots to Christian Church Homes for the development of affordable housing for seniors and veterans, with proceeds from the sale to be held in trust for building a free-standing Sunshine Food Pantry & Resource Center on the lot adjacent to the parking lot.

The ballots were distributed and counted. The tally was reported by Betty Yoder, with 29 votes of "Yes." One ballot was blank. Thirty-nine Interested individuals attended.

Rev. Maaga closed the Special Conference with a happy, excited congregation in prayer.
