Our United Methodist slogan is Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors which reflects our unique understanding of Christian discipleship. Last week I wrote about the theological foundation of Open Hearts. This week we will look at Open Minds. In our Methodist confession of faith, we affirm that the Bible "is to be received through the Holy Spirit as the true rule and guide for faith and practice." What gives us Methodists our Open Minds is that "we interpret individual texts in light of their place in the Bible as a whole. We are aided by scholarly inquiry and personal insight, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit." This means that in most United Methodist Churches there will be Bible Study classes and Adult Sunday school classes that focus on understanding the history and culture of the time in which Scripture was written so that the wheat of God's holy inspiration might be separated from the chaff of human cultural limitations. It is this open-minded approach to Scripture that had the United Methodist Church be among the first to ordain women. After decades of study, debate, and prayer, the great thinkers of our denomination concluded that Paul's words against the leadership of women were specific in nature, and a reflection of Paul's culture and time, and not to be taken as a general universal pronouncement. Being a Church with an Open Mind is a great responsibility. It requires that we take our Bible and theological education as Church members seriously. I am grateful that so many of you attend the Bible Study and Adult Classes that I offer. That is a reflection of Open Minds. Next week Open Doors!


Special Opportunities During Lent -

FACES AROUND THE CROSS

The Christian religious season of Lent is a special time to deepen your relationship with the Lord. FACES AROUND THE CROSS will be our theme. You are invited to participate in two wonderful experiences that will enrich your 40 day/40 night journey to Good Friday and Easter.

1) **Ash Wednesday** (March 2) We will begin our journey with a spiritual creativity workshop in which we will make a decorated mask that reflects our desire for greater closeness with God. The workshop will be from 10am – noon on March 2nd. Please r.s.v.p. with the Pastor by February 23rd so we have plenty of craft supplies. This will be followed by a short Worship service at noon. Everyone is welcome to come to Worship, whether or not you come to the workshop.

2) **Every Monday** at 7am during the six weeks of Lent we will be having <u>Sweet Half Hour of Prayer</u>. You are invited to come silently into the Sanctuary where we will have chairs around the cross and the altar. Pastor Mary will begin prayer promptly at 7am, with words being spoken, or silence, as prompted by the Holy Spirit. At the end of the half hour we will close with the Lord's Prayer and leave silently. No need to r.s.v.p. The Mondays of Lent are March 3, 7, 14, 21, 28, April 4, 11.



A Walking Sermon

In 1953 News reporters and city officials rushed to a Chicago railroad station to meet and interview the 1952 Nobel Peace Price winner.


When the train stopped, a gigantic man- 6 feet 4 inches tall— with a large white mustache and bushy hair, got off the train. The reporters and officials surrounded the old man, welcoming him to Chicago, telling him they were honored to meet him, and peppering him with questions.

The old man thanked them politely, and then, looking over their heads, asked if he could be excused for a moment. He quickly walked away from the crowd of admirers until he reached the side of an elderly black woman who was struggling with two large suitcases.

He smiled at her, picked up her luggage, escorted her to a bus, helped her aboard, and wished her a safe journey. He then returned to the news reporters and city officials and apologized, "Sorry to keep you waiting."

The old man was Dr. Albert Schweitzer (1875-1965), the famous Lutheran medical missionary doctor and theologian who had spent his life helping the poor in Africa.

A city official commented to a reporter standing next to him, "That's the first time I ever saw a sermon walking."
