
"Video meetings are more exhausting and stressful than those conducted face-to-face. Scientists identified four factors behind "Zoom fatigue"; the need for constant eye-to-eye contact, seeing one's own face on screen while talking, having to sit still for long periods, and the challenge of interpreting body language. "On Zoom," says lead author Jeremy Bailenson, "behavior ordinarily reserved for close relationships — such as long stretches of direct eye gaze and faces seen closeup — has suddenly become the way we interact with casual acquaintances, co-workers, and even strangers."

Boy Scouts of America

As you may have heard, the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) have proposed a bankruptcy settlement in response to claims brought about by

abuse survivors. Because the United Methodist Church has been a long-standing partner of BSA, and because some of the abuse took place in United Methodist Churches where troop meetings were held, the United Methodist Church has agreed to contribute \$30 million dollars toward the settlement. The California-Nevada Conference will be responsible for \$572,264. Our Bishop affirmed our commitment to keeping children, youth, and vulnerable adults safe in our Churches and to doing the work of healing for those who have been harmed.

The Mission statement for "SAFE GATHERING" is ... "Screen and educate staff and volunteers to help prevent abuse of children, youth and vulnerable adults"



"Turn on the news or pick up a newspaper and you will see churches, schools, and other organizations lambasted in the press for abuse scandals. SAFE GATHERING believes that all organizations can do better and are here to provide an effective but simple process to provide additional protection. When staff and volunteers go through several levels of background checks, reference checks, and comprehensive abuse prevention training, they know better — what to do, what to look for, and how to protect those they serve.

In days to come, I will be reaching out to members of the congregation to discuss and get a certification process established to ensure that our children, youth, and vulnerable adults are protected. Stay tuned!
