Every morning I pray for each and every one of you as I toss the ball back and forth for Freya the Awesome Dog and watch the sun rise in the back yard. The weather has been especially lovely this past week, so the sessions have been longer than usual. That, and the fact that the world has been so desperately in need of prayer. Some mornings it has been hard for me to transition from prayer to the other tasks of ministry. I am really grateful that we will be having a Sweet Half Hour of Prayer as part of our Lenten experience this year. As Jesus told us, "For where two or more are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of

them." (Matthew 18:20) You are invited every Monday of Lent from 7am - 7:30am to come silently into the Sanctuary where we will have chairs around the cross and the altar. Pastor Mary will begin prayer promptly at 7am, with words being spoken, or silence, as prompted by the Holy Spirit. At the end of the half hour we will close with the Lord's Prayer and leave silently. The Mondays of Lent are 3/7, 3/14, 3/21, 3/28, 4/4, 4/11. Will it take an extraordinary effort to get up and get over to the Church so early – not to mention discipline not to chit chat on your way in or your way out – of course it will! That's the point of Lent: stretching yourself so you can become more like Christ, including making a sacrifice for others. He's counting on us to show the world that love can yet be victorious. I'm all in. Are you?



teachings from Chapter 10 includes: "No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and He will not let you be tested beyond your strength, but with the testing He will also provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it." This Scripture passage, so often taken out of context and taught as "God never gives you more than you can handle" is a powerful reminder that humbling ourselves to love vulnerable people (the teaching from the prior chapter) does not come naturally. This past week we discussed "Word of God" vs. "Words of Scripture" - in the Methodist tradition we understand the "Word of God" to be Jesus Christ, "the Word made flesh" from John's Gospel, Chapter 1. Jesus Christ is available to believers in more ways than Scripture alone, including prayer (Matthew 18:20); care for the vulnerable and outcast (Matthew 25); through the presence of the Holy Spirit; through the Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion. This was a very rich conversation that helps lay the foundation for our look at women in leadership, homosexuality, and our treatment of people outside the Christian faith community. The class starts at 4, but you are welcome to log on to ZOOM at 3:30 for a time of fellowship.
