
Wednesdays - 6:30pm, on Facebook Live

Hello ladies,

Here is another reminder about our UWiF meeting coming up this Saturday, April 23rd at 10:00 across the street from Madeline Powell's house in the park area at Three Palm Mobile Home Community at 604 Pringle Avenue Space 3. If you lost the directions I sent in my last email, call me ((209) 400-8795) or just drive north on Lincoln Avenue, past the post office and turn left on Pringle Avenue. I live in the mobile home park on the LEFT as you come down Pringle 1/2 block. Do not turn into the mobile home court on the RIGHT. When you turn into Three Palms Mobile Home Senior Community, you will see a bluish gray clubhouse in front of you. I live right across the street from the park area in a green and white double-wide mobile home.

Our meeting will be held in the park area to the right of the clubhouse under 3 tall shady trees. Tables and chairs will be set up, the path into the park is wheelchair or walker accessible, and there is a handy restroom nearby in the clubhouse. I will provide iced tea, and paper cups.

Please bring your prepared sack lunch and a writing journal or notebook. We will reflect on God's nature blessings outside if it's good weather, and if it's rainy, we'll hold it in the clubhouse.

We hope to see all of you here for hopefully a fun picnic meeting on Saturday, April 23rd.

Bruceville Point Ministry Update

Pastor Mary was joined by twelve residents of Bruceville Point for a wide-ranging conversation about religious backgrounds, Scripture, and how people met their spouses. After lunch, Pastor Mary led a "Grief Group" that will likely become a group that talks more broadly about "Transitions." There were eight people at that gathering. Bob Janes and the others who gather for our online Worship in the theatre each week are deciding how to make the best use of their monthly time with Pastor Mary.



Did you know...that our humble little church has its beginning in Hicksville (now Arno Rd)? The cemetery is still there. In 1869, the grid for Galt was laid out with a church on each corner of town; Catholic, Episcopal, Disciples of Christ and Methodist. In 1880, the Methodist church's congregation moved from Hicksville to a Galt schoolhouse. Just not exactly sure where. Maybe near F and 6th St. The other 3 buildings are still standing. Why don't you try to find them? A fire in 1895, burned Eiler's Blacksmith shop to the ground (6th and C St.). Soon afterwards (1900?) a new Methodist church was constructed on that site, facing C St. In 1927, a new church was built on that site AFTER the 1900 church was turned to face 6th St. and placed at the rear of the new building.

In 1965, with cables holding the side walls together, it was obvious a new church building was necessary. Talk about growing pains! In 1970, the Building Committee acquired a \$30,000/7.5% interest loan, along with a \$10,000/1% interest loan. The old building was torn down and Galt UMC built a fellowship hall and shell of an educational hall (upstairs). The first services were held in the fellowship hall on Easter Sunday 1970. Fiftytwo years ago! Time really flies!

—Mona Stratton Church Council, Chair Being partners in improving the communities we serve is the Methodist "brand." For the past 18 months, Galt United Methodist Church has been exploring how to make better use of our properties for the enhancement of our community. We own our Sanctuary lot and parking lot at Sixth and C, a lot adjacent to our parking lot that has a little house in disrepair and a shed on it, and two empty lots that extend to Sixth and B. Two things became clear in our exploration process:

- 1) There is not enough affordable housing for Galt's seniors and veterans on a fixed income.
- 2) The Sunshine Food Pantry, which has been serving the working poor and seniors in our community for 12 years, has outgrown the Galt UMC social hall.

We decided to see if we could wed these two realizations into a single vision. A year ago, we began working with a highly reputable developer, Christian Church Homes, to explore building affordable housing for veterans and seniors on our two empty lots, then taking the proceeds from the sale of the lots as seed money for building a free-standing Sunshine Food Pantry and Resource Center on the lot with the house and shed adjacent to the Church The stumbling block has been the need for an additional lot for Christian parking lot. Church Homes to develop a "scattered site" development so that the residents of our lots can share a manager and support staff. Almost immediately, Christian Church Homes put a bid on property at 401 Lincoln which would have been perfect for our project. Despite our hope and best efforts, the City of Galt was not able at that time to make the required commitment of dedicated California State affordable housing funds and/or the deferrals and fee reductions for our project to move forward. In the wake of that disappointment, our exploratory committee and Christian Church Homes was asked by City staff to provide detailed information about housing needs and the funding apparatus for a high-density affordable housing project like the one we are proposing. This has been provided.

Last month, Amie Mendes, Economic Development Manager for Galt, suggested the possibility of developing the City owned property across the street from Brewster's as a mixed-use concept with the inclusion of senior housing above retail space. We are going to the City Council for public comment on April 19th at 6pm because we want to generate some positive momentum toward making this project a reality! One of the strategic goals set out by the City is to create "positive partnerships" within the community. We are that partnership! While the potential for 60 units for seniors and veterans across two sites hardly puts a dent in the demand, it is a start. Because the Christian Church Homes project is for affordable housing, this helps our City make its housing diversity goals, as well as freeing up monies on the part of residents for spending in the Historic Old Town businesses since the rent on the units cannot be more than 30% of the resident's income.

This past fall, Galt UMC members voted unanimously to take the sale money from the lots (once that happens), and invest it in building a free-standing Sunshine Food Pantry and Resource Center on the lot adjacent to our parking lot. For the past twelve years a group of Galt citizens have been making free food available to working families and seniors. This need has grown so much over the past decade, that the Sunshine Food Pantry has outgrown two spaces and is now outgrowing the Galt United Methodist Church social hall. In the past year families have come to depend on the Sunshine Food Pantry for between 25-50% of their monthly groceries, thus freeing up income for utilities, gas, clothing, etc. While Galt United Methodist Church has provided leadership for the Sunshine Food Pantry, we are joined in this effort by people from other area Churches, as well as Sunrise Rotary, and people of goodwill who have no Church or organizational affiliation.

Because the Sunshine Food Pantry belongs to the whole community, not just the Galt United Methodist Church, we are pursuing making the Sunshine Food Pantry and Resource Center its own non-profit. Our statement of purpose is: to provide food for families and individuals living with food insecurity; to provide a place for individuals and families to access information and resources; to provide programs and services to improve the quality of life for those experiencing economic and social stress; to connect diverse groups of people; and provide educational resources for the community.

Our team has been in communication with Supervisor Don Nottoli's office, and it is his intention to make American Rescue Plan Act monies available to help build our facility. Our Building Coordination Committee, chaired by David Herburger, has already met once and decided at that meeting to begin a process of listening and learning from various commissions, agencies, and individuals regarding what programs and resources would be helpful in further building up our community, in addition to helping those experiencing food insecurity. If you are able to come to the City Council meeting on Tuesday, April 19 at 6pm at City Hall to offer your support for our community project, I hope that you will do so. Please feel free to pass this synopsis on to anyone you think would be interested. We want to encourage our City to move ahead with enthusiasm in supporting Christian Church Homes in purchasing and developing the lot across from Brewster's, or another lot that can meet the needs of our scattered site project. In sharing this project with community partners over the past 18 months, we have been overwhelmed with support. We need to show that support to the City.
